## The Albert Hausammann Hong Kong Trust scholarship

The AHHKT supports students from Hong Kong selected to attend the WOSTEP watchmaking and polishing programs in canton Neuchâtel, the heart of Swiss Haute Horlogerie. Selected students are given the opportunity to attend one of the programs on site and get to know Switzerland and its culture and traditions from within.

The sponsorship covers tuition fees, student accommodation, and basic living expenses for the length of the program. Candidates are selected on the basis of their application documents, as well as a 2-day entry test including an interview, held in Hong Kong.

Watchmakers of Switzerland Training and Educational Program Watchcase and bracelet designs have become increasingly complex, and meeting quality expectations when polishing today requires many skills.

## Customer Service Polishing Technician program

The WOSTEP polishing program includes formal instruction and extensive practical training in the following areas:

- Fundamentals of micromechanics and metallurgy
- Introduction to electronic and mechanical watches
- · Polishing machinery and materials
- · Safety in the workshop
- Disassembly and reassembly of watchcases and bracelets
- Inspection of components
- Case and bracelet refinishing according to manufacturer's design and technical requirements
- Variable-speed polishing machines and their uses
- Preparation and finishing techniques: sandblasting, lapping, grinding, felt polishing, satin finishing, polishing, buffing and final finishing
- Water resistance testing
- · Quality control

#### Participants will achieve:

- Thorough knowledge and proficiency in polishing procedures
- Preservation of original shape and design of timepieces
- Increased efficiency and significantly reduced turnaround time
- ➡ High-level service and customer satisfaction

## Length of the program: 4 months, full time

Location: Neuchâtel, Switzerland

### **Certificate:**

A diploma is delivered to those who have successfully completed the course and passed the final examinations.

## **Eligibility**

### Who can be sponsored?

- Hong Kong residents over 21 years old
- With a keen interest in watch servicing and refurbishing, and strong motivation
- Good eyesight and a high-level of manual dexterity
- Able to speak and write English fluently

Only a small number of candidates will be selected. Preference will be given to students of limited means.

No previous experience in watchmaking or polishing is required.
