

WOSTEP – WHO ARE WE?

Founded in 1966 and supported by the Swiss watch industry, the Fondation WOSTEP, located in the cradle of watchmaking in Neuchâtel, offers training programs covering several watchmaking professions. As a reference center for watchmaking training and development worldwide, the Fondation WOSTEP transmits unique know-how through cutting-edge teaching. The range of training programs and consulting services offered by WOSTEP are considered quality standards. Employers around the world recognize WOSTEP certification as a proof of technical competence and demonstration of a solid training.

The neutral and independent Fondation WOSTEP is supported by 6 active members who together generate 90% of the turnover of the watch industry in Switzerland. Its ambition is to preserve and promote Swiss know-how abroad. Two pillars of the Foundation are the courses offered in Neuchâtel and the partnership with several schools abroad. The standardization of training programs and evaluation criteria implemented in cooperation with the industry ensures a true Swiss Made on a global scale.

With more than 50 years of experience, WOSTEP manages innovative projects with the close support of its members and donors and positions itself as a real training and skills center of the future.

CERTIFYING TRAINING

The Neuchâtel school offers certifying training in watchmaking and polishing.

The watchmaking programs are run through a phase of Watch Technician, then Customer Service Watchmaker after one year. Finally, Watchmaker is the additional year more specialized in manufacturing which allows to arrive at a panel of knowledge worthy of traditional haute horlogerie. The student develops in-depth and specific skills in tool maintenance, diagnosis with defect identification, maintenance, movement adjustment, complete service, polishing, precision adjustment, micromechanics and watch manufacturing.

The Customer Service Polishing Technician is a program that allows the reconditioning, disassembly and reassembly of watch cases and bracelet components made of various base metals according to their technical and aesthetic characteristics.

These certification programs make it possible to reach a high level in watchmaking and polishing careers with specific opportunities in international haute horlogerie.

COURS À LA CARTE

To complete our offer, the school hosts multipurpose courses. Practical or theoretical à la carte courses can be developed and implemented on demand. Train the Trainer, Precision Timing, Chronograph, Turning, as well as modular and specific polishing courses, such as laser welding refilling, are given regularly.



PROGRAM CURRICULUM

Program description

The Watchmaker I+II+III Fondation WOSTEP 3200-hour program is a rigorous course that seamlessly integrates three distinct programs into a single, comprehensive curriculum. Students progress beyond the Watch Technician and the Customer Service Watchmaker, culminating in a unified training experience known as the Watchmaker program. The program incorporates the complete package of certified watchmaker training offered by the Fondation WOSTEP. This structured curriculum imparts advanced skills vital for success in traditional fine watchmaking, offering global employment prospects.



Main topics

- History of timekeeping
- Organisation of workshops and of customer care
- Knowledge of tools
- Basic Micromechanics
- Tool preparation and maintenance
- Basic knowledge of watch movements
- External and internal interventions
- Watch and movement analysis
- Knowledge of mechanical and electronical watch movements
- Knowledge of watch complications
- Movement service

- Escapement and regulating-organ adjustments
- Chronograph
- Advanced escapement and regulating organ adjustments (incl. chronometry)
- Proficiency in micromechanics (incl. material science, turning, milling and high-end finishing)
- W-01 School Watch project (incl. component and spare part manufacturing, assembling and COSCtiming)
- Polishing

Career opportunities

With the *Watchmaker I+II+III*, graduate candidates have opportunities to work in customer services, brand-service-centres, independent repair shops, vintage watch services, watch development and manufacturing. This program incorporates the full competences of the Fondation WOSTEP watchmaking certificated programs.

Requirements and target audience

The Watchmaker I+II+III program is the most proficient, for candidates seeking a career-path in traditional fine watchmaking craftmanship. For the enrolment there are no mandatory candidate requirements, however it is recommended to have good technical comprehension, a strong interest in mechanics and a keen eye for details.

- Please note that this program is very intensive and requires strong motivation.
- Candidates must be over 21 years old.
- Language requirements: fluent English, both spoken and written. It is not necessary to
 provide a certificate but the candidate's language proficiency level should correspond to the
 following minimum requirement:
 - IELTS: International English Language Testing System: 5.0 6.0
 - CEFR: Common European Framework of Reference for Languages: B2

TIMETABLE AND PARTICIPANTS

- Monday to Friday: 08:00 12:00 / 13:00 17:00.
- The program amounts to approximately 3'200 hours (22 months) in total, including:
 - several-weeks work experience (subject to availability of companies and manufactures)
 - 8-weeks holidays per year (2 in December, 5 in June/July, +7 Swiss public holidays
- Maximum 8 participants per session.

REQUIRED MATERIAL

The necessary tools and material will be provided.

MEALS

Meals are not provided and are at the participants cost.

ACCOMMODATION

Participants have the possibility to stay in the WOSTEP student apartments located close to the school. Alternatively, a list of further accommodation options will be sent to them upon request, in order to allow them to make their own reservation elsewhere.

The cost for accommodation in the WOSTEP student apartments for 22 months is as follows: (Single bedroom with free Wi-Fi. Shared kitchen, bathroom and laundry facilities)

- 15/16 m2 room: CHF 17'050.- = CHF 775.-/month - 13/14 m2 room: CHF 15'400.- = CHF 700.-/month - 11/12 m2 room: CHF 13'750.- = CHF 625.-/month

Accommodation fees: payable prior to the beginning of the program

PROGRAM FEE

- CHF 34'600.- per person (accommodation and meals not included)
- The tuition fee includes the following:
 - Support for administrative procedures upon arrival and administrative expenses
 - Complete toolkit and theory books of horology. The kit and books will remain the property of the student
 - Special courses on specific products, visits to factories
 - Resources (infrastructure, tools, machines, training material, movements, spare parts and components)

An additional amount of CHF 13'200.- will be required as a prepaid financial guarantee by the State of Neuchâtel to ensure your basic domestic needs are covered. This will be refunded to you on a monthly basis, minus the Swiss health insurance premium (approx. CHF 350.-/month) which is compulsory for anyone staying in Switzerland over 3 months and who is not a holder of the official European health insurance card (EHIC) or of an equivalent insurance coverage recognized by the state of Neuchâtel.
